Some tips on how to care for your tree



We're happy to have helped you with your tree - see you next year!

Leave the netting around the tree until you have it secured in the stand. This makes it easier to put up!

If you are not putting up your tree on the day you buy it, keep it in a bucket of water or make a new cut on the bottom of the tree (remove 1/2 inch to 1 inch)

All trees need water! - this will keep the tree fresh and alive and prevent needles shedding by 90%, Place the tree in a tree stand that is large enough to hold at least one gallon of water

Pour water into the tree stand and maintain this level throughout the Christmas season. The tree should never be without water as the tree will seal up and not take in any more water unless you make a new cut at the bottom. Use warm to hot water for the first watering to help open the pores in the tree

Add glucose or 7•up to the water when intake starts slowing down as this would act like a sweetener and improve intake Decide on a good placement for the tree. The tree must never be placed near a fireplace ,radiators or wood stove. Doing so will cause the tree to dry out prematurely and become a fire hazard

Turn the tree so that you can view the best side and enjoy looking at it throughout Christmas!

After Christmas, leave the tree at a collection point for recycling, (we are happy for you to drop it back to us!) or stand it up in the back yard as a winter shelter for birds.
